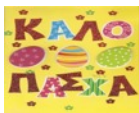

## The FIRST DAY of the NEW CREATION

The origin of Christianity is different from the beginnings of any other religious movement in the history of religions. Christianity appeared as a community, as the Church, which arose with the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

What distinguishes the early Christians from those who followed Judaism or the religions and cults of the Hellenistic age was primarily their conviction about Jesus and his resurrection and their personal relationship with the risen Christ.

The message of resurrection is the center of the New Testament, which is justifiably called the book of the Church. The Bible would never have been written without the faith of the early Christians in the resurrected Christ. The Scripture is permeated by the sense of the overpowering Presence of the Risen One! All the historic documents for the resurrection of Christ are of Christian origin. There could not be non-Christian witnesses to the resurrection, for those to whom Christ appeared after His resurrection became his followers and witnesses.

The letters of Saint Paul are the earliest written documents (AD 48) and are permeated with the faith in the risen Christ. The earliest record of the event of the resurrection is the list of appearances that Paul received from the primitive Church and incorporated and handed down in his letter to the Corinthians (1Cor. 15:3-8):

*"For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that He appeared to Peter, then to the twelve. Then He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of who are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. Then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, He appeared also to me."*

Beloved, the historic documents exist, the evidence is overwhelming, the eyewitnesses are real. Let us be transformed and believe – that Christ is Risen, Truly He is Risen!

## Teatime treat

Make these sweet sandwiches for a Mother's Day tea party.


**What you need:**

- 4 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread
- Cellophane
- Adult help



**What you do:**

1. With an electric mixer, whip the cream cheese in a bowl until fluffy.
2. Add cream, powdered sugar, and lemon juice. Continue whipping on high speed until mixture is stiff.
3. On each slice of bread, spread a layer of the mixture. Then arrange some sliced strawberries on top.
4. Place the sandwiches together, with filling on the inside.
5. Wrap tightly in cellophane. Chill for two hours so the filling sets.
6. Trim off crusts with a serrated knife. Cut sandwiches in squares or triangles. Serve and enjoy!
